### **POLICY**

St Joseph's "Behaviour Management" policy will reflect the morals, ideals, expectations and behaviours desired by our school and the community. Children are encouraged to take responsibility for their actions and demonstrate respect towards others.

### **CONSEQUENCES**

2. When disciplinary measures are taken, it is the action which is unacceptable, not the person. Punishment of a corporal or demeaning nature of any kind is considered inappropriate.
